# FORESTRY PLAN



In an effort to improve the natural environment of our entire property, about 50 mature trees will be removed.

A very conscientious effort at maintaining the integrity and health of the vegetation on our property is being made.

The trees that are to be removed are now marked and will be removed within one year of the signing of the contract.

#### From ground the Diocese

The Rev. Daniel Richards, Grace Episcopal Church, Traverse City: The future of the church is in her beginning. We are to obey Christ and make disciples, not members. We have to get back to the core of our discipleship as a community: worship, formation, proclamation. Episcopalians are formed by the reformed lay monastic dream of Cramner, a people shaped by Daily Office and weekly Eucharist, Book of Common Prayer and Bible. From the core, you can head out into medieval liturgies or evangelical outreach, but we have to put money, time, and structure back into the center. We are going to close a lot of churches if we keep trying to reform the church through her butlers instead of forming her children. Follow Christ and the rest will follow.

These donations will be sent to help the Analican missionaries in Peru, the Rt. Rev. Mike and Linda Chapman.



More than two years ago, Bishop Mike and Linda Chapman began work to plant a new diocese in central south Peru for the Anglican Diocese of Peru. They live and work in a large region ranging from desert areas and the mountainous Andes. The people of the region are descendants of the Incas, Spaniards, and Quechua peoples, and work mostly farmers and herdsman. In great swaths of the region they live much like they did 500 years ago.

The Chapmans' primary goal is to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ and develop Analican worshipping communities. as well as to develop ways to promote the people's handicrafts and produce to a wider market. The Chapmans are currently working to establish Mission Centers throughout the large area they serve, training and equipping Peruvians to serve in ministry. These collections will help them grow their ministry. THANK YOU!

This means we need ten people to attend the lunch and learn more about Open Doors and how it is transforming our community one person at a time by providing stable housing and support services to low-wage individuals working to make a better life for themselves. There is no cost for the lunch, and parking vouchers will be provided fort he Rave and Epic parking ramps. You will hear from Open Doors staff about the program and from 3 residents about how Open Doors has changed their lives. After the presentations, you will be given an opportunity to donate to the work of Open Doors, but there is no pressure, and donations are confidential. Please consider giving one hour of your time to find out about the need for affordable housing in Kalamazoo, how Open Doors is addressing that need, and how you can make a difference.



The Book Club will meet on Wednesday, April 10 at 7 pm.


They are reading **Years of Wonder by Geraldine Brooks** You are invited to join us—we'd love to have you! It is a great opportunity for learning and fellowship.
