RELAY FOR LIFE

It's a nail-biter every time, but once again, St Timothy's Relay for Life Team exceeded our goal to raise at least \$2500 to fight cancer. As of July 15, our team raised, after expenses, **\$2,764** to the American Cancer Society. A few more pledges are yet to be turned in, so we may hit \$3,000 in donations before the deadline of August 31.



The weather was perfect for Richland Area Relay for Life events on June 15-16, 2012. This year St Tim's was the only concession providing nourishing food for the walkers and others attending Friday evening Relay. We ran out of brats and burgers twice, and also sold grilled chicken breasts, chips, pop, water, ice cream, and fruit. Our food and cooking were very popular and St Tim's has been requested to continue it next year!

We are so grateful to Richland Meat Center's owners, **Jim and Kristina Nieuwenhuis**, for donating the brats and burger for grilling over \$330 worth of great meat. Stop by (at the stoplight at M89/43 and 32nd Street), and thank Jim. The store is open on Sunday's after church, so that's when I stop to buy.

Our team leadership was Pete Hawk, Jari Pulford, Val Ozolins, Joe and Pat Rapp, and Deb Russell. I (Deb) was out of town for the event, but Jari managed the tent and money, and Pete continued his grillmeister duties assisted by others. The Boudeman girls sold lemonade and cookies, and Becky Kloosterman and her kids returned for a visit from their new home out of state to help with concessions. Other volunteers included Donna and Dave Pinneo, Linda Enzinger, Jon and Carolyn Schutte, and Johnna Monroe.

Richland area Relay for Life met or surpassed all its goals for 2012!!! With 27 teams, our Relay bested its goal of \$79,000 by more than \$10,000. As of July 12, \$89,100 had been raised, with more to come. There was an increase in registered cancer survivors: 84. Cancer Advocacy Network members/donations increased to 31. Sponsor and sponsor donation goals were met, as well. **Kristie Maiers**, who works for Richland Township, was a superb chair of the event.

The Richland Area Relay for Life event was started several years ago, in part prompted by the death of Melanie Chojnowski, a young woman from our area. While there was no Team Melanie this year, several of our parishioners donated in her memory, and the **Boudeman's girls with help from Mom Kathryn,** set up a Lemonade and Cookie stand ("Melanie's") that earned \$125 for our team.

Almost all of us have been touched by cancer - in our own lives, or in the lives of our families and friends. This year, we lost a valiant fighter in parish member **Jill Gould.** She was a huge part of Richland Area Relay for Life and many funds were raised as a tribute to her, including a pancake breakfast at Relay.

We earned funds for Relay as follows:

Luminaria and cash donations \$1,025 Food Concession \$1,174 Silent Auction \$565 Total: \$2,764

In-Kind Contributions paid for tent, tables and chairs, meat, water, fruit, cheese, and supplies, (covering \$573 of approx \$700 in expenses), as well as the Silent Auction items: a three night stay at a cottage in Ludington and a quilt made by a St Timothy's member.

Any remaining 2012 donations should be submitted <u>by August 25</u> to Deb Russell or Jari Pulford with checks made out to ACS (or American Cancer Society).

The 2013 theme will be "Once Upon a Cure" - A Fairy Tale Theme. Fundraising goes on all year round. Gull Lake High School's Sept 28 football game will be a fundraiser to benefit Relay for Life/ACS. Kickoff is at 7 PM, with a cancer Survivor Walk on the Gull Lake High School Stadium Track at half-time.



about the fund, and can provide advice about including the fund in your will.




