Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

Peace in the full biblical sense is much bigger than merely the absence of war or a lack of personal tension. The Hebrew word for peace is shalom.

Shalom (see sidebar) refers to the world functioning as it should. It speaks of harmony and love between: God and people, people and each other, and people with creation. It speaks of a broken world put back together; the world redeemed. That is what I sense here at St Timothy's -- a sense of shalom.

We are a people seeking to renew a right spirit within us; seeking to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27)

When I started the interview process, one of the first things I asked was to see last year's Annual Report. It showed a healthy thriving parish that is seeking to follow God. Melissa and I could not believe that the church in our prayers actually existed. St. Timothy's is the church that we have been praying for since we started the call process in Wisconsin-- a church seeking to love God and one another.



shalom

(shah-lohm'),

A Hebrew term for "peace, wholeness, well-being." It describes the ideal human state, both individual and communal, the ultimate gift from God. It came to be used as a personal salutation, both for greeting and departing.

Sunday Dollars


Thanks for each and every single dollar bill. Every dollar collected is used to pay down the mortgage. In 2012, \$1,868 was collected.






