RECTOR SEARCH

The Search Committee has brought candidates into St. Tims for interviews. The interview/meeting with each candidate took place

over a 2-3 day window, so there was a significant opportunity to get to know and spend time with each candidate. The SC is scheduled to meet again on March 6 to discuss the candidates and what next steps should be taken. We are very excited about the candidates and are making substantial progress.

GIVING, PRAYING, FASTING

From All Saints, Highland Park (in Los Angeles)



The core of the Church's Lenten traditions is found in the three disciplines of Giving, Praying and Fasting.

GIVING

Of course we pledge to the church, but during Lent we also are invited to give sacrificially when possible to a charity or a person in need. Giving sacrificially frees us from the attachment to material possessions, and reminds us that God, the giver of all gifts, is truly in charge.

PRAYING

Of course we pray regularly, but during Lent we are invited to pray more. Lenten is an opportunity to change how we pray and to try new techniques such as praying with Icons, or praying together with your spouse, partner or family. Lent is a wonderful opportunity to focus, anew, on our communication with God.

FASTING

A fast is the denial of something we want but really do not need. We can fast from food, from television, from destructive behaviors, etc. Whatever the fast, the goal always is to awaken us to the core of who we are, and to the suffering of others who live in want.

MOVIE NIGHT

St. Tim's is hosting a Movie Night on Sunday, March 18 at 5:00 p.m. Plan to come and watch the 2009 movie "Invictus" (PG13) There will be popcorn, pizza and drinks.

This film takes place after Nelson Mandela has been released from prison in South Africa and has been elected president of the country. He is desperately trying to bring together two groups in his country that have been struggling against each other--the Blacks and the Boers (Dutch settlers). South Africa is slated to host the rugby World Cup. For years the teams were always white settlers, and the Blacks had no part in the sport and hence did not support the South African team. Mandela sees this as a way to bring the two groups together. He makes a point of supporting the team, and bringing Black youth to learn from the players. He enlists the captain of the team (played by Matt Damon) in the campaign. The result is widespread Black support for the somewhat mediocre team when they play in the finals, and the determination not to give in which leads them to victory. It is a metaphor for the uneasy union of the different populations. A most interesting movie for its story of a sports championship, but also for the underlying growing acceptance between the populations.

I. Budget and Finance Committee

--works with the Bookkeeper to track monthly finances

--develops a plan to refinance the mortgages --develops a plan for the Rector's sabbatical and continuing education

--develops the annual budget after the stewardship campaign has been completed

--interfaces with property management agency on rental issues

--considers financial requests from Vestry Committees and Ministry Teams

Bequests and Endowments Subcommittee

--publicizes and invites parishioners to make use of our endowment fund to enable the receipt of endowments and bequests

Audit Subcommittee

(Steve Frank, Tom Monroe)

--completes its audit of our books in a timely manner, and submits a written report to the vestry and diocese

II. Building and Grounds Committee

--Performs an annual assessment of all B&G issues at church, rectory and grounds

--prioritizes needs for presentation to the Vestry --ensures all maintenance contracts are current and effective

--follows up on any incomplete/inadequate contracted work

--maintains parish policies on heating and cooling --establishes and oversees teams of workers

- --to do regular maintenance
- --to do ad hoc maintenance
- --to maintain the grounds and gardens

--memorial garden work with memorial garden subcommittee
