how often do we take time to consider what it means. The purpose of Holy Week is to re-enact, re-live, and participate in the events leading to the Passion of Christ, and to help us observe a Holy Lent. (See: Anamnesis.) The observances of Holy Week began in Jerusalem in the earliest days of the Church. The first service of Holy Week is Palm Sunday, when we remember the entrance of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. He was triumphantly hailed as he rode a donkey across palm fronds into the city – to shouts of "Hosanna in the Highest."

We celebrate Holy Week every year, but

Maundy Thursday

We will start off the evening with an Agape meal (potluck). Following that, we will explore Passover Seder, as Jesus and the disciples may have eaten. The purpose of Maundy Thursday is to remember the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples. You will not want to miss this special evening service. At the conclusion of the service, the altar is stripped of all liturgical elements and we will start the Gethsemane Watch.

Gethsemane Watch

Join with fellow pilgrims, throughout the night, as we watch with Christ in the Garden before His trial and execution. Judas left during the Last Supper, but Jesus and the remaining disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed – and the disciples kept falling asleep.

Good Friday

The origin of the term 'Good Friday' is unclear, but the meaning of the day is without doubt – it is the Friday on which the Church keeps the anniversary of the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ –where we will experience the dramatic Good Friday readings. We hear hear the story of what Christ went through for us.

The Great Vigil of Easter

The Easter Vigil is the oldest of Christian holidays. It is a night of watching and rejoicing, the night of transition from death to life, from grief to joy. The vigil opens with the Service of Light – the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the paschal candle. At this service, we renew our baptismal vows and if fortunate, have a baptism. It is a time of recounting how God has moved through history and is active in our lives today.

Easter Day

On this day, we will pull out all the stops, literally. It is on this day, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and his victory over death. We come together as a community to celebrate what God has done in our lives.

To get the full Easter experience, come to as many of the services as you are able. I promise, the Spirit of God will move you in unexpected ways.



Adult Education:

"What Makes for Peace in Israel and Palestine" will be the topic of a talk after church on March 17. The



speaker, the **Rev. Naim Ateek**, is an Palestinian Episcopal minister who directs the interdenominational Palestinian Christian organization Sabeel in Jerusalem, which began in order to help Christians in the area follow their Christian teachings while living under oppression. It has grown now to include cooperation and conversations with Muslims and also Jews who are working for justice, and also support groups across the world in Britain, Ireland, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Germany, Australia, Canada and the United States (26 states). Rev. Naim has written several accessible books, some of which will be available at the talk. He is in southwestern Michigan for several talks on the 17th & 18th, and will be attending our church that morning.


St. Timothy's participates with both the Hardings and Meijer Community
