
talking about what gifts we as individuals and as a church have. Friends are sharing with friends, parents with children, spouses with each other, and you with me.

#### It's Official!!

Over the past few months, St. Tim's has enjoyed the musical gifts of **John Forsleff** seated in the sanctuary at the piano, leading the choir and playing musical interludes. Until recently, this was an interim arrangement. We are pleased to announce that John has accepted the position of permanent Worship Musician at St. Tim's. (**Applause, applause!**) In John we are so lucky to have found not only a highly accomplished musician, but a thoughtful and upstanding young man.



John has provided some bio information to help us get to know him a little better:

"I was born in Flint Michigan on August 1, 1990 into a family of musicians. Both my parents studied at Western Michigan's School of Music. My father is currently the orchestra and general music teacher at the public schools in the Flushing area and he also plays viola for the Flint and Saginaw Symphonies. My mother is a vocalist and teaches Band and Choir as well as religion at my former high school Powers Catholic. Needless to say, I was naturally inclined towards music at a very young age. I started piano lessons at age six and have been studying ever since. I also developed an ear for church music when I was very small. My father was and still is the music minister at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church where I started to play drum set at age seven. Throughout the years I made my way around many different instruments such as horn, trumpet, and guitar. I never seemed to be able to settle with just one!"

"I now am studying for my Bachelors of Music Education degree for choral and instrumental with an emphasis in piano and voice studies. I am in my senior year but have at least another year ahead of me after this coming spring semester. I hope to find a job teaching after I graduate. My hope is that I can teach my future students value of music and the impact it can have on our lives."

"Music is my passion. I believe that it is one of the greatest gifts God has ever created. Music manifests itself in the only things that truly matter in our lives; peace, love, joy and beauty. It allows us to express that which cannot be translated into words from the very depth of our souls. It is not simply a vehicle for expressing emotional ideas, but rather purifying for the soul and healing for the heart. Contrary to most beliefs, music is not competitive. Its sole purpose is to spread peace within."

"I hope that during my time here at St. Timothy's our choir can grow along with the congregation for music is open to all who wish to take part in it. This church naturally has a very strong attachment to music and I am thrilled to be a part of such a community."

"I encourage the entire congregation to sing with us because each voice helps unify our community. Thank you for all of the warm encouragement I have received over the past few months. It truly means a great deal to me."

## **Sunday Dollars**

Does everyone have their dollars for Sunday?

The Sunday Dollar program started here on June 3 and has been a success ever since. It is a very simple program, just place a single dollar bill in the collection basket.

Every single dollar is used to pay down the mortgage.

The first month alone we collected \$245 (an average of \$61.25 per week). The second month we collected \$355 (an average of \$67 per week). By September, we were able to pay an extra \$1000 off the mortgage. The principal on the mortgage was \$115,828 on Jan.1. By September 30, the principal is \$104,234, a drop of \$11,000!

An extra benefit is that the interest on the mortgage was budgeted at \$6300 through the end of September but was actually only \$5628, saving us about \$700 in interest so far. This is money that can be used in other church programs.

We project that the mortgage principal about \$100,000 by Dec. 31 with a saving in interest of more than \$1000. We should thank the Stewardship Committee for bringing us this idea, and the Congregation for taking it to heart to participating.

#### **CLOTHING COLLECTION**


We are collecting adult & **children's clothing** for the Hands of God Ministry. Please bring in your items to St. Tim's, there is a collection box in the lobby.





Trey Eldridge and Sharon Barry are available to answer specific questions you may have about the fund, and can provide advice about including the fund in your will.




