Starting my first rectorship has given me opportunity to ponder "What does it mean to be a Church?" One of



the challenges is that this is an overly broad question. I think a more appropriate question is "What does it mean to be a Christian?" An even more probing question would be "If I am a Christian, what do I do?" It's kind of like when you have a 30 page term paper due and you look at that first blank page... It looks so blank... just waiting to be filled. But where do you start? You start by researching the topic; getting as many facts about the topic as you can.

When it comes to being a Christian, where do we start? How do we research ourselves? One of the tools that I have found helpful is a Spiritual Gifts Assessment. The idea is that God has given each one of us special gifts (Romans 12:6-8, First Corinthians 12:8-28 and Ephesians 4:11) and we are to use them for the glory of God. On October 14th, everyone will be given a survey to fill out to help identify their Spiritual Gifts. The assessment will hopefully help us identify what areas the Lord has gifted each one of us. Once we, as individual, identify what were are to do as Christians, we are better able to identify what we are to do as a Church.
